Key grants in 2024 included:

 other emergencies
- \$300,000 to support scholarships through Kroger Scholars, which enables eligible dependents of Kroger associates to continue higher education
- \$120,000 to support US United's Holiday Spectacular, which provided food and essentials for more than 2,000 families in 12 cities during the holidays
- \$100,000 to U.S. Hunger to help pack 1 million meals for families in Orlando, FL, in honor of Martin Luther King Jr. Day




